ACT Research Program Proposals & Publications Committee: Synopsis of key points from ACT data use procedures

- All final draft manuscripts and abstracts that use ACT data must be approved by the ACT Proposals & Publications (P&P) Committee prior to submission. The P&P committee reviews manuscripts on a monthly basis and abstracts in one to two weeks. Investigators who wish to submit to scientific journals or professional meetings should be mindful of these review timeframes.
- Acknowledgment of funding sources: Scholarly works that use ACT data <u>must</u> acknowledge ACT funding sources (U19AG066567 & U01AG006781). Please refer to the <u>Manuscript Acknowledgement Guide</u> for additional information and or ask an ACT investigator for assistance.
- Approved use: While new ideas may emerge in the process of a study, please remember
 that you may only use the data to conduct research related to your P&P-approved project. If
 your original research question or analysis plan is modified, please submit an updated
 proposal clearly indicating these changes to the P&P Committee. If you would like to use the
 data for a purpose other than what was described in your approved proposal, please submit
 a new proposal to P&P.
- Data destruction: We ask investigators send their analytic datasets to ACT and then
 destroy all ACT datasets (electronic as well as paper copies) within two years after
 publication of results and/or completion of grant funding period. We will send a reminder as
 you get closer to the end of the project.
- **Regular updates:** You will be asked to complete a project update form biannually, which will be sent by e-mail. Please return your completed form to the ACT team within two weeks.
- PubMed Central submission requirements: The NIH requires that any publications which
 arise from an NIH award be deposited to PubMed Central. We therefore request that you
 submit any accepted publication to PubMed Central.
